

United Consumers Credit Union 2021 Scholarship Guidelines

United Consumers Credit Union will award two \$1,500 scholarships to credit union members age 17 or older who:

 Have graduated or will be graduating from high school by June 2021, and will attend a college or other accredited post-graduate program on a full-time basis in the fall semester 2021. Scholarship funds will be paid directly to the student/institution.

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 Are currently enrolled in college or other accredited post-graduate program for the spring semester 2021 and plan to enroll on a full-time basis in the fall 2021 semester. Scholarship funds will be paid to the student/institution after enrollment in the fall 2021 semester is confirmed.

Alternates will also be chosen for each scholarship in the event the winner of the scholarship loses his/her eligibility.

All scholarship applications, essays and letters of reference must be postmarked no later than March 15, 2021, and sent to:

Please note, all application materials will become the sole property of UCCU, for use at the credit union's discretion, and will not be returned to the applicant.

Applicant Eligibility

Applicants and/or their parents/guardians must have been United Consumers Credit Union members for at least six months prior to the scholarship entry deadline. Credit union volunteers, employees and their immediate families are not eligible. For the purpose of this scholarship, immediate family includes: spouse, parent, child, grandchild, sibling and any of their spouses.

Failure to adhere to application guidelines or rules of eligibility will result in scholarship disqualification.

The credit union shall actively promote equal opportunity policies and practices conforming to federal and state laws against discrimination, and shall not discriminate in offering scholarship consideration on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, marital status, sexual orientation or veteran status.

Selection Criteria

The scholarship winners and alternates will be chosen by a committee comprised of credit union employees, credit union volunteer board/committee member(s) and other volunteers. The winning applicant will demonstrate a balanced combination of:

- · Academic achievement
- Strong work ethic (part-time work and/or volunteerism)
- · School and community activities
- Written expression (essay of at least 500 words)
- Character (letter of reference)

Scholarship Essay

Please attach a typed essay of at least 500 words on one of the following topics:

- 1. What is the most important financial lesson you've learned, and how does your credit union membership factor into that lesson?
- 2. Member ownership, volunteer leadership and excellent personal service set credit unions apart from other financial institutions. Which of these three distinctions do you feel is the most important and why?
- 3. Community service is part of the credit union difference. Please tell us about a time when you contributed your time or talents to your community and what you gained from that experience.

In order to maintain a fair evaluation and selection process, we ask that you do not specifically name any UCCU members in your essay.

Letter of Reference

One letter of reference from any one of the following sources is required for consideration for a UCCU scholarship:

Employer, Teacher, Coach, Counselor or Clergy

The letter should include *the name and daytime phone number of the person providing the reference*, as well as this person's relationship to the applicant. This letter may cite examples of the applicant's character, workplace or school accomplishments or any information describing why the applicant is a worthy candidate.
